


**Branch Newsletter - December 2023** 


### **Next Meeting:**

# David Whitehead found something interesting during a recent holiday:

### A NEW FOREST SURPRISE

I expect some of our well travelled members will already be aware of what this missive is all about but some may not, so here goes......

On holiday in the New Forest just a few weeks ago, my wife and I were driving from our base in Lyndhurst to Lymington and having just passed through Brockenhurst, my wife suddenly said that she had seen a sign for a CWGC cemetery.

We didn't investigate immediately as we were on our way to catch the ferry to the Isle of Wight but we went back the following day and discovered that the Church Lane site, during the First World War, was the location for No.1 New Zealand General Hospital and the adjacent military cemetery was the final resting place for the patients who died from their wounds.

If you ever find yourself in the area, it is well worth a visit, as is St Nicholas's Church which stands next to the cemetery. Directions — when leaving Brockenhurst towards Lymington, Church Lane is on the left just after you've gone over the level crossing. There is parking at the church and from the church a path leads to the cemetery.
